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Assessment Adjustments Private Acts of 1975 Chapter 58

SECTION 1. The Wilson County Board of Equalization shall have published in a newspaper of general circulation in the county, not more than thirty (30) days after the conclusion of their annual session, a

circulation in the county, not more than thirty (30) days after the conclusion of their annual session, a statement of assessment adjustments made by the Board during that session. Said statement shall identify, by name, the owners of properties on which the assessment has been changed, the original assessment, and the new assessment made by the Board. Said publication shall be paid for by the County.

SECTION 2. This Act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Quarterly County Court of Wilson County on or before August 1, 1975. Its approval or non-approval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the County Court and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Act, as provided in Section 2, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, but for all other purposes shall be effective only upon being approved as provided in Section 2.
